


This epic train journey starts from bustling Dar es Salaam on the coast of Tanzania travelling through Zambia, Zimbabwe, Botswana into South Africa to finish at Cape Town.

From Dar Es Salaam it traverses the Selous Game Reserve – the largest on the continent and a vision of timeless Africa – before climbing into the Great Rift Valley negotiating the tunnels, switchbacks and viaducts of the spectacular escarpment to the Tanzania border.

The train joins the Tazara line in Zambia and continues to Chisimba Falls where guests enjoy a bush walk.

Continue through Zambia crossing the mighty Zambezi River and into Zimbabwe where guests overnight at the Victoria Falls Hotel.

A few days safari at Madikwe National Park before the diamond mines of Kimberley, the historic village of Matjiesfontein before finishing in stunning Cape Town. Available in reverse.



DAY 1



TANZANIA

YOUR RAIL JOURNEY BEGINS IN DAR ES SALAAM

09:30 - Check-in reception at the Kivukoni Room, Serena Hotel, Ohio Street, Dar es Salaam. Transfer to Tazara Station.

12:00 - Depart from Tazara Station in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. Guests may freshen up in their suites before joining fellow travellers in the lounge car and observation car, which will be at the front of the train for the first 72 hours – a different aspect that our rail enthusiasts enjoy. Please ensure the Train Manager or Administration Deputy is in possession of passport. Lectures will take place throughout the journey during the morning and/or afternoon in the lounge car. Please consult Lecture Sheets for details.


13:00 - Lunch is served in the dining cars. The train travels the fertile lands of Tanzania towards the Selous.

16:30 - Tea is served in the lounge and observation cars.

19:30 - Dinner is served in the dining cars en route to Fuga Halt for overnight. Dress: Formal

DAY 2



TANZANIA

VISIT THE VAST SELOUS GAME RESERVE

05:30 - Breakfast is served in the dining cars until 07:00.

07:00 - Enjoy a game visit in the Selous Game Reserve, the largest in Africa at 55,000km2 (time permitting).

13:00 - Lunch is served in the dining cars. The train travels towards the jungled Udzungwa Mountains and negotiates the dramatic switchbacks, viaducts and tunnels of the escarpment.


16:30 - Tea is served in the lounge and observation cars.

19:30 - Dinner is served in the dining cars en route to Mlimba for overnight. Dress: Formal

Victoria Falls: It is a good idea to familiarise yourself with the list of activities available: Tour of Victoria Falls; helicopter over Victoria Falls; whitewater rafting; bungee-jumping; golf etc. You may book these excursions yourself at the hotel OR beforehand on the train with the on-board historian – today between 17:00-18:30. Cash accepted.


MAKAMBAKO


07:00 - Breakfast is served in the dining cars until 10:00. The Southern Highlands of Tanzania are covered with grasslands, savannas, woodlands and forests. Miombo woodland and savanna predominates at lower elevations while the higher mountains are home to Afromontane evergreen forests, grasslands and shrublands, and part of the Southern Rift montane forest-grassland mosaic ecoregion, which extends into the nearby mountains of Malawi and Zambia.

- **09:00 -** Arrive at Makambako and enjoy a stroll through the town (time permitting).
- 13:00 Lunch is served in the dining cars. Arrive at Makambako and enjoy a stroll through the town (time permitting).
- 16:30 Tea is served in the lounge and observation cars. The train passes baobab forests and ascends the Rift Valley to the border, almost exactly the midpoint between Africa's two Great Rift Valley lakes.
- 19:30 Dinner is served in the dining cars. Dress: Formal






CHISIMBA FALLS & ON INTO ZAMBIA


06:00 - Breakfast is served in the dining cars until departure.

08:00 - Enjoy a visit to Kundalila Falls. Set high on the Muchinga Escarpment, the Kaombe River falls in multiple stages over a cumulative 30m and eventually over a lip about 70m in thin veils to a deep, lush, natural swimming pool. The rolling hills and white rocky outcrops of the Muchinga Escarpment serve as a divide between the drainage basins of the Zambezi River (Indian Ocean) and the Congo River (Atlantic Ocean). From the top of the falls, there are sweeping views over the Luangwa Valley, which is part of the Albertine Rift, the western branch of the East African Rift. Guests may take the moderate but steep hiking trail to the base of the falls for an amazing photographic opportunity or enjoy a swim.

- **16:30 -** Tea in the lounge and observation cars.
- 19:30 Dinner is served in the dining cars. The train is turned at Kapiri Mposhi. Dress: Formal



AT LEISURE ON BOARD THROUGH ZAMBIA

(±06:00) - The train crosses the Kafue Railway Bridge - a 477-metre long steel girder truss bridge of 13 spans each at 33 metres supported on concrete piers.

- **13:00 -** Lunch is served in the dining cars. The train travels to Zimbabwe.
- **16:30 -** Tea is served in the lounge car and observation car.

DAY 8





ZAMBIA & ZIMBABWE

STOP & OVERNIGHT AT THE MAJESTIC VICTORIA FALLS

Please pack a small overnight bag for the stay at Victoria Falls Hotel. See below for inclusions/ exclusions. Meals are taken at the Victoria Falls Hotel. Currency exchange is available at the hotel (passports not required); there is a business centre and WiFi available throughout. If you are crossing the border into Zambia during your stay, please obtain your passport from the Train Manager or Administration Deputy.

07:00 - Breakfast is served in the dining cars until 10:00. Border formalities take place. Cross the Victoria Falls Bridge. Arrive at the incomparable Victoria Falls. Disembark with an overnight bag and walk across to the hotel. Welcome address on the lawn followed by lunch at Jungle Junction. Luggage will be delivered to the rooms.

15:45 WINTER / 16:15 SUMMER - Meet in the hotel foyer before departure for the sunset cruise on the Zambezi.

19:30 - Dinner at the Livingstone Room, Victoria Falls Hotel. Dress: Smart Casual (strictly no safari-wear, shorts, sandals or sneakers)

Plunging over the lip of the Victoria Falls is the largest body of falling water on earth. The mighty Zambezi, fourth longest river in Africa, is about 2kms wide above the falls and cascades dramatically over a precipice 1.6km in length and 108m at its deepest, compressing the vast volume of water into a chasm 50m wide. The sound can be deafening, the aspect magnificent and the memory indelible. In autumn, the spray is so great it inhibits photography while in spring the seasonal flow considerably reduces leaving large slabs of brown basalt exposed on the lip.



ZIMBABWE & BOTSWANA

CROSS FROM ZIMBABWE TO BOTSWANA


07:00 - Breakfast is served in the dining cars until 10:00. Border formalities take place.

13:00 - Lunch is served in the dining cars. The train crosses the Tropic of Capricorn and the eastern edge of the Kalahari Basin. Known as 'Kgalagadi' in Botswana, the Kalahari (which extends to 900 000km2 and covers much of Botswana, parts of Namibia and South Africa) is not a true desert as it does experience small amounts of rain, with some areas enjoying up to 250mm. The surrounding basin covers over 2 500 000km2 extending farther into Botswana, Namibia and South Africa and encroaching into parts of Angola, Zambia and Zimbabwe. It is part desert, part plateau. The only constant river, the Okavango, flows into a delta in the northwest forming marshes that are rich in wildlife.

16:30 - Tea is served in the lounge car and observation car.

19:30 - Dinner is served in the dining cars. Dress: Formal

DAY 11





BOTSWANA & SOUTH AFRICA

CROSS FROM BOTSWANA TO SOUTH AFRICA & MADIKWE GAME RESERVE

Please pack a small overnight bag for the stay in Madikwe. See below for inclusions/ exclusions. Spa facilities available (own account). Payment in ZAR or by credit card only. Times of meals and activities confirmed on arrival.

07:00 - Breakfast is served in the dining cars until 09:30.


10:00 - Transfer (±90 min) to a lodge in Madikwe for a two-night stay. Border formalities will take place en route and guestsare required to present themselves to officials (luggage may be searched). Lunch is served upon arrival. Afternoon tea and game drive (approximately 3 hours).

19:00 - Dinner at the lodge. Dress: Casual

Madikwe is a prime malaria-free Big 5 wildlife reserve bordering Botswana. It lies within a transition zone between the North West Province bushveld and Kalahari thornveld with enormous volcanic intrusions, wide open plains and the riverine environment along the Marico River. As a result, the region is host to an incredible diversity of species from both ecosystems with a rich assortment of vegetation and more than 300 resident and migrant bird species.

Early morning game drive (approximately 3 hours).

07:00 - Breakfast is served at the lodge until 09:30.

19:00 - Dinner at the lodge. Dress: Casual



PRETORIA & TOUR SOUTH AFRICA'S CAPITAL

06:00 - Breakfast is served in the dining cars until departure. The train travels through the goldfields.

08:00 - Transfer (±60 min) to Pretoria for a city tour followed by lunch on the Rovos Rail Station platform. Enjoy a walking tour of the station and locomotive workshops (weather permitting). Return (±75 min) to the train.

19:30 - Dinner is served in the dining cars. Dress: Formal

DAY 15

SOUTH AFRICA

KIMBERLEY & THE DIAMOND MINES

06:00 - Breakfast is served in the dining cars until 10:00.

Enjoy a tour of Kimberley's Diamond Mine Museum and the Big Hole. Capital of the Northern Cape, Kimberley is well known for the discovery of diamonds that led to its establishment in 1871.

13:00 - Lunch is served in the dining cars. Travel through the Karoo, a vast semidesert region that was once an enormous inland sea. Over millions of years, volcanic matter was ground down and deposited as silt upon the seabed to form what geologists call the Karoo system.

16:30 - Tea is served in the lounge and observation cars.

19:30 - Dinner is served in the dining cars. Dress: Formal

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner.





DAY 16

SOUTH AFRICA

THROUGH MATJIESFONTEIN

07:00 - Breakfast is served in the dining cars until 10:00. During breakfast, there is a chance for guests to disembark the train at Whitehill Siding and walk the 5km into Matjiesfontein. A member of staff will accompany the group.

Disembark at Matjiesfontein for an opportunity to stroll through the historic village. Of special interest is the museum on the platform and a collection of historic cars and railway carriages to the right of the Lord Milner Hotel.

About an hour after Matjiesfontein, the train arrives at the first of four tunnels on the pass. The first tunnel is 13.5km long so

guests are to be careful when walking through the train and may wish to turn on necessary lights.

13:00 - Lunch is served in the dining cars. The train climbs ± 750 m down the escarpment through the Hex River Valley.

16:30 - Tea in the lounge and observation cars.

19:30 - Dinner is served in the dining cars. Dress: "1920s" Theme or Smart Casual

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner.



CABIN FEATURES

Each train has accommodation carriages, dining cars, a lounge car (±36 seats), small gift shop, smoking lounge (±8 seats) and observation car (±32 seats) with open-air balcony.

The cabins are refined and spacious offering guests privacy and comfort with double or twin beds and fittings and facilities that are of the highest standard.

HOW FAR IN ADVANCE DO I NEED TO BOOK?

This train tour is an exclusive trip with very limited departures through the year. Consequently we strongly advise our clients to book as far in advance as possible to avoid disappointment. This particularly applies to the higher level cabins which there is strong demand for.

CAN YOU OBTAIN & ADVISE ON THE VISAS FOR US?

Visas (if required) can be quite complex so we recommend using a specialist visa agent and have an arrangement with CIBT Visa Central who offer a reliable service for all the visas you will need for your trip. Of course, we provide all the necessary documentation which must accompany your application. Note that the onus is upon the client to ensure passports and visas, as may be required, are valid prior to departure for Africa. Passports must have at least five blank visa pages and must be valid for at least six months from your return-home date.

On the various journeys we travel: South Africa, eSwatini, Namibia, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Tanzania, DRC and Angola. Some nationalities are eligible to purchase port-of-entry visas. Immigration forms will be available on board. Please ensure you have a minimum of US\$200 in cash with you. Angolan and DRC visas must be obtained prior to travel. We request that Tanzanian visas are obtained prior to travel when possible.

ARE YOUR TOURS FINANCIALLY PROTECTED?

Trips sold as packages to UK clients come with financial protection either through our ATOL if the trip includes a flight or insurances which comply with the UK package travel regulations for any trip that does not include a flight. In addition our ABTA membership means we must adhere to their strict code of conduct. Trips sold by us as an agent for train operator do not come with financial protection as even in the event of our insolvency your booking with the train operator would still exist and be honoured.

CAN YOU BOOK INTERNATIONAL FLIGHTS FOR US?

Absolutely! Our ATOL license means that we can book international or indeed internal flights. We get particularly good access to the best deals on British Airways as we are an appointed operator.

CAN YOU BOOK FURTHER TRAVEL FOR US?

Yes! We can offer extensions to further explore the destinations at either end of the trip. Just ask us for details.

SCHEDULING TIMES, ROUTES & EXCURSIONS

We wish to bring to your attention that Rovos Rail is solely reliant on the traction and railway services provided by the countries through which we travel. Rovos Rail reserves the right to cancel or amend our routing, any excursions and the tour departure dates provided we can offer clients alternative excursions or departure dates. Rovos Rail cannot guarantee excursions or departure and arrival times. Our obligation to transport guests from departure to arrival points on schedule will override any commitment to excursions although we will endeavour to carry out all of the off-train experiences. We strongly caution against same-day air travel on departure/arrival days due to possible delays with flights or the train.

We do accommodate children but we kindly ask parents to be sensitive to the adult nature and atmosphere of the train by keeping them respectful and quiet. Long journeys are not recommended for under 13s. Children between 0-2 years old are not permitted to travel. There are no childminding facilities or activities available for children on board. Ask us for the full Rovos Child Policy document for further details.

ROVOS RAIL STATION TOUR & MUSEUM

A highlight for guests is a visit to the private station headquarters in Capital Park, Pretoria, where the Rovos team work assiduously to ensure the locomotives and trains are maintained to the highest standard. This is the busy hub of a provisioning operation that is world-class in terms of efficiency and attention to detail. The tour will show you the nuts and bolts of the company. We also have a museum showing a historical collection of train paraphernalia.

GRATUITIES

Gratuities for the staff are at your discretion. If you wish to show your appreciation in this manner, there will be a suitably marked envelope in your suite that you can hand directly to the Train Manager who will distribute any amounts on a pro-rata basis (share)among the staff on board. An amount between ZAR100-300 (± US\$10-20) per person per night is suggested, depending on the length of your journey. At the game lodges, it is customary to tip guides and lodge staff an estimated ZAR150 (± US\$10) per guest per day.



CHECK-IN

Please check-in a minimum of one hour before departure. Should you wish to visit our museum or do a site tour at Rovos Rail Station in Pretoria, we suggest arriving two hours prior to departure. If Pretoria is your arrival point, we suggest delaying your pick-up so you can enjoy the site tour. Passports are required at check-in. No vouchers are required. Luggage will be tagged and placed in your suite on board the train where you will find a full itinerary pack.

AMENITIES

Rovos Rail provides a complete amenity bag with the following South African biodegradable and/or recyclable products: soap (40g), bamboo tissues, shampoo (50ml), hand and body wash (50ml), hand and body lotion (50ml), lip balm (15ml/7g), insect repellent spray (100ml for journeys over 4 days), reusable bamboo rounds, bamboo ear buds and a compostable shower cap. Plug-in hairdryers – in addition to your bathroom unit (if applicable) – are available on board as well as sun cream, shoe mits, nail files, sewing kits, ear plugs and insect repellent.

PETS

We do not allow any pets or emotional-support animals on board.

CURRENCY

- South Africa Rands only. We accept all major credit cards on the train.
- Outside of South Africa Rands areaccepted in Namibia and eSwatini.US Dollars are accepted in Zimbabwe, Tanzania (Dar es Salaam only), DRC and Angola. Cash is highly recommended. Hotels and major dealers accept credit cards.
- US Dollars printed before year 2013 or that look worn will not be accepted. Low denominations recommended for shopping/gratuities.

• Larger denominations recommended for exchanging money to local currency (especially in Tanzania) as you get a better rate.

DIETARY REQUIRTEMENTS

We cater for food allergies provided a detailed request has been made at that time of your reservation. If a special request has not been made, the chefs will endeavour to prepare suitable meals with the ingredients available on board. We regret we are unable to prepare meals requiring strict religious observance in the preparation.

DINING & DRINKS

Meals on board are served in one sitting only in the dining cars. Breakfast: 07:00-10:00 • Lunch: 13:00 • Tea: 16:30 • Formal Dinner: 19:30. Bar service is from 07:00-±01:00. All meals are served at these times unless otherwise stated in the timetable. A gong heralds lunch and dinner. We have a carefully curated selection of local and international beverages on board with a proud focus on South African offerings. Our varied collection includes wine, brandy, gin, rum, vodka, whisky, spirits, digestifs, grappa, liqueur, beer, cider, non-alcoholic options, mixers and a cocktail menu. All beverages on board are included while special requests, such as international sparkling wine, may be pre-ordered at an additional cost. Please ensure these requests are made 30+ days before departure.

ELECTRICITY

220V AC 50Hz 3-point round-pronged wall plugs and 110V/220V 2-pin plugs for shavers and chargers. USB ports are in each suite. International adaptors available. A generator supplies power. Please be aware that certain breaks in power are necessary when servicing is required.

DRESS CODE

- Days on board are smart casual: Neat, conventional yet relatively informal in style combining casual and formal clothing pieces.
- Dinner on board is formal: For gentlemen, a collar and tie are mandatory while a jacket is optional. For ladies, we suggest cocktail/evening dresses or suits. Please respect this dress code.
- On long journeys we enjoy themed evenings where guests can dress up accordingly or opt for smart casual: 1 x "AFRICA" evening and/or 1 x "1920s" evening. See itineraries.
- Off-train excursions: We recommend comfortable walking shoes, sun lotion and hats. If required, blankets and rain capes are available.
- Game drives are on open vehicles so please dress accordingly: mornings can be cool then warm up considerably; afternoons can be warm then cool down considerably.

DRESSING GOWNS

We provide a comfortable one-size-fits-all gown plus slippers for each guest for use on board the train. If you wish to take one home, they are available to purchase from the Gift Shop.

GIFT SHOP / ADMINISTRATION

There is a small gift shop on the train and at Rovos Rail Station in Pretoria. Due to the varying exchange rates, credit cards are preferred. The Administration Deputy on duty has a basic first aid kit and personal essentials (toothbrushes, razors, earplugs etc.). He/she will also fulfil any administrative requirements and check your onward arrangements.

LANGUAGES

The staff on board mainly speak English and local languages. For most of the long journeys and dependent on the language, translated itineraries and on-board information will be provided.

LAUNDRY

There is a LIMITED laundry service (10 items/day) on board comprising household washers, dryers and steam irons. The turnaround is 48 hours so we are unable to handle a week's worth of laundry. There are no drycleaning facilities en route or on board. Please note that while this a complimentary service we cannot be held responsible for items that may be damaged or lost in the process.

LOCOMOTION

Use of steam has become increasingly difficult over the years as more and more water and coaling facilities have been scrapped. Diesel or electric locomotives are used while steam is used in and around the area of Rovos Rail Station in Pretoria only.

LUGGAGE

It is possible to store luggage in your suite under the bed or above the door on a luggage rack, which provides ample space for storage. There are no luggage restrictions on board although we do not recommend more than two large suitcases. On selected long journeys, guests are provided with a Rovos Rail tog bag that can be used for overnight trips or hand luggage on aircraft. A soft bag is preferable on plane transfers with a luggage weight restriction of 15kg.

TEMPERATURE & TIME ZONES

All public cars are fitted with gas-filled air-conditioning systems. Each suite has an individual air conditioner with temperature controls that can also be set to heat mode. Windows should be closed while operating the air-conditioning unit. Electric under-blankets are fitted on the bed.



MEDICAL

All guests are solely responsible for ensuring they are capable of undertaking the tours and activities.

- Please inform us at the time of your reservation if you have any medical conditions, physical disabilities or allergies.
- We have a doctor on board on the African Trilogy, Copper Trail, Trail of Two Oceans and Dar es Salaam journeys.
- Anti-malarial precautions are recommended. Malaria areas: eSwatini, Kruger Park, Northern Botswana, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Etosha, Tanzania, DRC and Angola.
- Recommended immunisations (not required): Hepatitis A + B, Polio, Tetanus, Cholera (low risk).
- Ebola is confined to the northeast of DRC. We traverse the very southern tip of the country thousands of miles away on the Lobito journeys.
- A Yellow Fever/Medical Exemption Certificate is essential if travelling to/from DRC and Angola. Although all countries travelled through don't require this, countries guests return to after the trip often require them.
- Please consult your clinic or doctor. TRAVEL DOCTOR AFRICA local 0861 300 911 or international +27 (0) 11 214 9030.

MEDICAL EMERGENCIES

Each train is equipped with a standard medical kit, oxygen, automated external defibrillator and a wheelchair. For emergencies there are private healthcare hospitals available. Outside of South Africa, private hospitals are not guaranteed. We can organise evacuation either by road or air to a medical facility should this be required (own account). All our Train Managers have completed First Aid up to Level 3 and are trained in emergency situations. We do, however, strongly recommend that you explain your concerns to your travel insurance company so they can provide you with the necessary cover to meet and exceed such an eventuality.

MOBILITY

Although we can accommodate guests with walking problems, we recommend that an able-bodied passenger accompany them. The train is not suitable to accommodate wheelchair-bound passengers. Should you have mobility impairments/restrictions or special requirements, we urge you to inform your travel agent or Rovos Rail at the time of booking. Ask us for further information about mobility.

SECURITY

Each suite has an electronic safe in its cupboard. We ask guests to shut shutters, or better shutters and windows, when they are not in their suites. When passing through stations, please be especially careful. All train doors are locked from the inside. You can lock your suite door from the inside.

THE TRACK

The track we travel on is not maintained in a consistent manner. You may wake up at night and imagine the train traveling at high speed. This is due to the track conditions below. The train can travel at 60km/h (37mph), and speed is reduced to 20km/h (12mph) on bad sections. Earplugs can be purchased in the Gift Shop and in your amenities bag if you find it too noisy.

WATER

The water used on the train is carried in tanks under each coach. These tanks are filled every day but they cannot be topped up while the train is travelling. Please assist us by using water responsibly. Water inside the suites has been filtered and chlorinated; it is safe for bathing and brushing teeth only. Please use the bottled water provided for drinking. Our bottles are biodegradable and made from plants.



MAGAZINES, MAPS & GAMES

There are board games, cards, a card table (dependent), books and magazines available for your use in the lounge and observation cars while on board. In your suite is a map, itinerary and the Journeys magazine featuring articles of interest related to your route. If the map supplied is not comprehensive enough you may purchase a more detailed map from the Gift Shop.

MOBILE DEVICES & INTERNET

In maintaining the spirit of train travel there are no radios or television sets on board. The use of mobile phones, laptops and essentially anything that has the ability to disturb other guests is confined to the privacy of your suites only. The reception is poor while the train is moving. It is advised to contact your service provider to ensure the correct settings for network services are activated. Wi-Fi is available at our lounges in Cape Town and Pretoria and at most off-train accommodation (although not always guaranteed).

SERVICE

A dedicated host/ess is available 24 hours a day. They can be called from the telephone in your suite. Your suite is cleaned daily and there is a nightly turndown service. The Train Manager and Deputy Train Manager are on hand throughout the journey to help with any queries. The Administration Deputy is available for an administrative requirements and is based at the Gift Shop.

SPECIAL OCCASIONS

Please note at the time of your reservation if you are celebrating an occasion as we'd like to share it with you.

SMOKING

On board the train, smoking is allowed in the smoking Club Lounge only. HOWEVER, please be mindful of other guests who do not smoke, that the train is generally made up of wood and DO NOT throw flammable items such as cigarette or cigar butts off the train. Bush fires in Africa are a constant and dangerous hazard. Please note at the time of your reservation if you are smoking or non-smoking so that the appropriate room might be requested at the hotels/lodges.

SUITES & COACHES

Measurements in centimetres (cm) = Length x Width.

Each train has accommodation carriages, dining cars, a lounge car (± 26 seats), small gift shop, smoking lounge (± 11 seats) and observation car (± 32 seats) with open-air balcony. The suites are elegant and spacious offering passengers privacy and comfort with double or twin beds and fittings and facilities that are of the highest standard.

All have en-suites with shower, toilet, basin and bath (Royal only), tea facilities, safes, air conditioning, linen and amenities and are serviced daily. There is adequate storage and small cupboards with hangers and shelves.
